Six Nations Police Charge Unlicensed Cannabis Dispensary Operating on Territory

On Thursday January 31st, 2019, Six Nations Police executed a search warrant resulting in charges being laid against an unlicensed Cannabis Operator. The search warrant was executed at a third line building, site of the unlicensed “Georgia Peach” cannabis dispensary that recently opened.

According to Six Nation Police, large quantities of dried cannabis, packaging material and scales were seized at the location. Large amounts of cash and cocaine were also found and seized during the search.

It is acknowledged that the Six Nation Police moved as quickly as they could, ensuring they completed the necessary due diligence with the search warrant. These actions resulted in charges laid to a 51 year old Six Nations man and 53 year old Burlington man for Possession of Illicit Cannabis, Distribution of Illicit Cannabis and Possession for the purpose of Distribution contrary to the Cannabis Act.

Six Nations Elected Council believes unregulated dispensaries pose a serious risk to public safety. Six Nations Elected supports the quick and safe actions of the Six Nations Police during this incident.
