

## A By-Law to Provide for the Observance of Law and Order

Decision made at General Council Meeting April 9, 1959

## PLALM FUELSER &

The Council of the Six Potions of the Grand Miver Bond of Indians at a meeting held Obsweken, Orderio, April 9, 1959, makes the following by-law pursuant to paragraph (c), (d) and (r) of Section 80 of the Indian Act.

By-law No. 4

A by-law to provide for the observance of law and order and the prevention of disorderly conduct and nuisances within the Six Nations hereastic late in a fight term

1. No person shall disturb, interrupt or disquiet any meeting of the Six Nations Council, any religious festival or any assemblage of I dians met for the consideration and discussion of matters of public interest or for any lawful purposes, by profane discourse, by rule or indecent behaviour or by making nomes or noises either within the place of such meeting or near it as to disturb the order or solemnity of the meeting.

2. No person shall solt on the floor of the Council House or on the floor of the Six Mations Schools or of any public building.

3. No person shall use insulting or abusive language toward any person on the Reserve.

4. Any person who violates this by-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on surmary conviction to a fine not exceeding out that is contained a input containt for a term not exceeding without shall be both the out approximate.
