THE SIX PATIONS INDIANS OF THE GRAND RIVER

RESIECTIE Destruction of Public Buildings and Property.

WHEREAS it is necessary to pass a by-law respecting destruction of public buildings and property.

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE SIX NATIONS INDIANS OF THE GRAND RIVER HEREBY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. Any person who destroys or damages any public building on the Reserve, or demages or destroys any sign or any public property, shall upon conviction before a Magistrate or Justice of the Peace forfeit and pay the cost of the damagez and a fine not exceeding One Hundred Dollars or be imprisoned for a term not exceeding thirty days, or both fine and imprisonment.

Passed in General Council at Chsweken on the First day of May A.D. 1952.
