

A By-Law limiting the weight of vehicles passing over bridges on Six Nations Indian Reserve

Passed in General Council on January 3, 1963.

The fricil of the Six Nations of the Grand River Band of Indians at a meeting held this third day of January, 1963 make the following by-law pursuant to paragraph (b) and paragraph (r) of Section 80 of the Indian Act.

By-law No. 19

A by-law limiting the weight of vehicles passing over bridges on Six Nations Indian Reserve.

1. In this by-law

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- (a) "council" means the council of the Six Nations of the Grand River Band of Indians;
- (b) "bridge" means a bridge referred to in paragraph 2 hereof;
- (c) "bridge inspector" means a person appointed by the council to erect and maintain signs at the approaches to a bridge:
- (d) "wehicle" means any wagon, cart, motor car, motor truck, semi-trailer truck, trailer, traction engine, tractor, propelled or drawn by any kind of power but does not include a motorcycle or bicycle.
- 2. No person shall drive or move or permit or cause to be driven or moved a vehicle upon or over any of the following bridges when the weight of the vehicle or the combined weight of the vehicle and load is in excess of ten thousand (10,000) pounds:

Spring Creek Bridge No. 4, on Road No. 137, in Lot 2, between Concessions 2 and 3, in the Township of Oneida, in the County of Haldimand;



Boston Creek Bridge No. 4, on Road No. 263, between Lots 6 and 7, in Concession 3, in the Township of Tuscarora, in the County V of Brant;

McKenzie Creek Bridge No. 9, on Road No. 266, situate between Lot 6, in Concession 6, in the Township of Tuscarora, in the County of Brant, and Lot 13, River Range, in the Township of Tuscarora, in the County of Brant.

- No more than one wehicle at a time shall be driven or moved upon or over any bridge;
- 4. The bridge inspector shall erect and maintain a sign indicating the restriction imposed by this by-law in a conspicuous place at least 100 feet from each end of the bridge.
- 5. No person shall remove or deface or attempt to remove or deface any sign erected by the bridge inspector.

- 6. A Peace Officer may at any time stop and cause to be weighed any vehicle or any vehicle and load that attempts to pass over or has passed over a bridge and for that purpose may require that the vehicle be driven to the nearest scales.
- 7. Where the nearest scales are closed for the night the vehicle may be detained by the Peace Officer until the re-opening of the scales on the following morning.

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- 8. No action lies against a Peace Officer or the council for loss or damages suffered by any person resulting from the enforcement of, or compliance with, sections 6 and 7 hereof.
- 9. Any person who vilates any of the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), or imprisonment for a term not exceeding thirty (30) days, or both fine and imprisonment.

By-law Number 2-77

The Connect of the Six Hations of the Grand River Band of Indians at a meeting hold that Six day of Container, 1977 make the following by-law pursuant to paragraph (b) and puragraph (r) of Section 81 of the Indian Act.

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1. In this by-law

- (a) "council" means the council of the Six Mations of the Grand River Band of Irdians;
- (b) "bridge" needs a bridge referred to in paragraph 2 heroof;
- (e) "bridge insymptor" means a person appointed by the Council to erect and maintan eigne at the approaches to a bridge;
- (d) "vehicle" means any wagon, cart, motor car, motor truck, semi-brailer truck, trailer, traction engine, tractor, road-making machinery or other convergence that is driven, propelled or drain by any kind of power but does not include a metographs or bicycle.
- 2. No nerows shall drive or move or parmit or cause to re-drives or moved a vehicle upon or ever any of the following bridge when the weight of the vehicle or the combined weight of the vehicle and load is in excess of sixteen thousand (16,000) pounds:
 - Bridge No. 19, in the 1974 Roads Needs Study of McCorrick, Rankin and Associates Limitod; situate on Road No. 272, between Lot 1, in the Township of Taskersta and Lot 1, in the Township of Cosids, in Concession 2, in the Course of orange and Daldi out, respectively.
