59TH ELECTED COUNCIL UPDATES – October 6, 2025

OHSWEKEN, ON – Six Nations of the Grand River 59th Elected Council (SNGREC) shares the following updates with community from their October 6, 2025, meeting.

Six Nations Cannabis Commission (SNCC)

- SNGREC has approved the appointment of Leslie Powless as the new SNCC Chair, and Kim Frazer as a SNCC Commissioner. Councillors Alaina VanEvery and Carole Lesley Greene have also agreed to sit with the SNCC until a full complement of commissioners has been appointed.
- SNGREC has approved to remove all current SNCC Commissioners, effectively immediately, due to the failure to adhere to obligations under the Six Nations of the Grand River (SNGR) Cannabis Law, corporate bylaws, and the Memorandum of Understanding between SNGR and the SNCC.
- SNGREC supports these changes to improve

the regulation of cannabis on the territory.

Six Nations Parks & Recreation – Facility Fee Waiver Policy

- SNGREC has approved the Six Nations Parks & Recreation Facility Fee Waiver Policy, including the Fee Waiver Matrix, Fee Waiver Request Form, and Fee Waiver Costing & Review Sheet, effective immediately.
- As part of the implemented Facility Fee Waiver Policy, rental fees for the Dajoh Youth & Elders Centre (gym and meeting rooms) will continue to be waived for all Six Nations band members (with proof of membership, e.g., Status Card) and for community-serving groups (with documentation, e.g., official letter). Waiver requests from for-profit organizations, whether band member owned or not, must be presented to SNGREC separately for consideration.
- Security deposits will be waived for all Six Nations band members and communityserving groups with documentation.
